



## Resident Profile

This report sets our resident profile in relation to gender, age, ethnicity, disability, religion/faith and sexual orientation in comparison to the Haringey borough profile. The London Borough of Haringey statistics are derived from the most recently available Office of National Statistics data or Haringey Councils 2010/11 Residents' Survey

Homes for Haringey does not currently collect profiling information from all residents in relation to gender reassignment, although this information is monitored in key areas including monitoring ASB and hate crime and was collected as part of the 2011 Resident survey.

### Gender

Females are over-represented. This is expected given that women are more likely to be lone carers for children and, as such may be prioritised for applications for social housing. Older women may be over-represented as they are likely to live longer than men.

We currently have age information on 92.2% of its residents. Note that the percentages in this section will be different as tenancies are not typically held by minors.		

Younger people are under-represented as tenants of Homes for Haringey properties. This is to be expected as single young people who are not disabled or vulnerable are not prioritised in applications for social housing. In addition, we do not include under18s in our profiling of tenancies. All other categories are over-represented in Homes for Haringey stock, becoming more marked with increasing age.

The Black Caribbean (16% to 7%) and Black African (16% to 8%) groups are the most over-represented groups in Homes for Haringey stock.

The "other" category other may be over-represented but this group has been aggregated to simplify reporting but may not be entirely representative of the diversity of groups in this very mixed borough. White British is underrepresented (26% to 51% in Haringey) although mixed white (19% to 12%) is slightly over represented. Nearly all other groups are under-represented, although not to the degree of White British.

## Disability

Tenants with disabilities are overrepresented because this group is prioritised for social housing. Older people are more likely to have a disability and may have moved into council housing many years ago.

It is likely that we hold a greater level of information for tenants with disability as they are considered to be vulnerable and are contacted more frequently than general needs tenants. Disabled tenants are more likely to be living in Supported Housing and have more contact with Housing Managers updating needs data than general needs residents. Disabled tenants are more likely to let us know they are disabled in order to access targeted services.

## Religion

Christian and Muslim groups are overrepresented at the expense of nearly all other religions. The greatest under representation is Jewish (0.5% to 2.2%, although the numbers in this report are probably too low to be too conclusive.

We currently have sexuality information on 43.8% of its residents. Data is not currently available for the London Borough of Haringey as a whole.		

Stonewall estimate the lesbian, gay and bisexual community to be between 5-10% of the population and we would expect this representation in Haringey. Over 98% of respondents in our survey indicated that they are heterosexual. This appears to be high. However, social housing prioritises families and individuals with children which may explain the under-representation of this group.
